Immunizations:

Immunizations - Kindergarten entry, Grade 6 and Grade 9

- Children can receive their Kindergarten entry immunizations starting at age 4 and should receive the
 recommended vaccines prior to school entry. Information on how to book Kindergarten immunizations
 can be found on our <u>children and youth immunizations</u> page.
- In B.C., <u>school-aged children and teens</u> are offered vaccines in **Grade 6 and Grade 9**. Grade 6 and Grade 9 students can receive these <u>immunizations by public health nurses at school clinics</u>. Information and consent forms for Grade 6 and Grade 9 students will be sent home at the beginning of the school year. Parents/guardians are encouraged to discuss <u>consent for immunization</u> with their children.

COVID-19 immunizations

- In addition to the above immunizations, all children and youth are encouraged to be up-to-date on COVID-19 immunizations. Currently everyone 6 months of age and older is eligible for COVID-19 immunizations.
- Booster shots are available for everyone aged 5 and older this fall.
- COVID-19 vaccines are not provided at school clinics.
- We encourage all children and youth to be registered at <u>gov.bc.ca/GetVaccinated</u> so they will be notified when it's time to book appointments.

Flu immunizations

- Flu vaccine is recommended yearly for all children and youth 6 months of age and older.
- Flu vaccines usually become available in October.
- Flu vaccines are not provided at school clinics.

Child health screenings:

Dental

Kindergarten dental screening will continue to be offered by our Public Health Dental team. During the 2022/2023 school year they will offer screening to all Kindergarten students. Students who are identified as having a dental concern will be provided with a referral and resources to access dental care.

Vision

Children should have their vision checked yearly by an optometrist once they enter school. In B.C., children up to the age of 18 are eligible for one free eye exam per year. Parents/guardians can book their child's vision test at their local optometrist using the Find an Optometrist database or by calling the BC Doctors of Optometry at 604-737-9907.

Good hearing is essential for speech and language development and early detection of hearing loss is important.
