# Principal's report given by Linda Pollastretti

- Football, Volleyball, Soccer, Cross County & Swimming all up and running.
- Grad Cruise was Wednesday October \_\_\_\_
  - The district has made a decision that may affect future grad cruises. As a result charter buses had to be used coming back from Vancouver. It will potentially increase the cost of grad cruise next year by \$15-20
- Student led grad committee is meeting.
- Grad clothing order is due to arrive later this week.
- Ian Tyson is coming this week and speaking about investing in themselves
- Teacher shortage across BC- at play at Mouat now. A science class is currently without a permanent teacher. Across the district there are 30 teacher vacancies. This will potentially have an impact on your child.
- If your child is in grade 9 they will see a performance indicator (proficient, emerging...) instead of a letter grade. A 3 does not equal a 75% but a range. Grade 10-12 will have a letter grade and a percent on their final report card but will have a performance indicator up until that point. You will see an increase in teacher comments.
- In June you will see a grad status. Starting next semester you will see an interim report card. They were not able to start it as of this semester but this will be ongoing starting next semester.
- Starting next year you will not need to look at your student's MyEd, there will be a separate parent portal.
