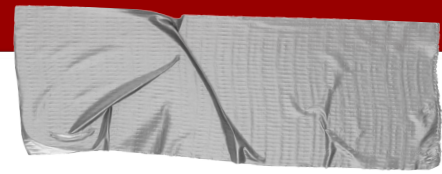

Required grade 10 courses:

- 1) Math 10: Workplace or Foundations & Pre-Calc 10
- 2) Science 10
- 3) Social Studies 10 or *Sciences Humaines 10* (FI)
- 4) English 10 (Composition & Literary Studies 10 or English First Peoples)
- 5) Physical Health Education 10
- 6) Career Life 10 or *Éducation au choix de carrière et de vie 10* (FI)

You must write the provincial Numeracy and Literacy Assessments 10 in order to meet graduation requirements

How to Complete Grade 10

Required vs Elective Course

Some courses you must pass and others you do not in order to graduate.

For example, you must pass English 10 before you can do English 11.

Summer School

Some courses you can take in summer school and others are not offered.

AVS/Online

Discipline and determination

If you know that you have failed one of the required courses in semester 1 and you did not repeat it in semester 2, you must sign up for that course when you are selecting courses for next year.

This means that you could take an English First Peoples 10, 11, or 12

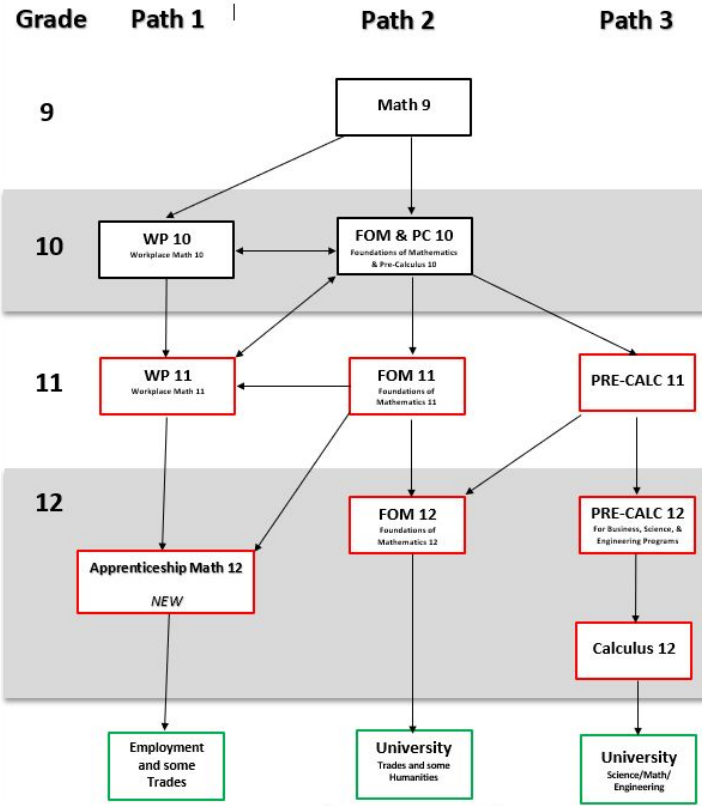
OR

A Social Studies option: Contemporary Indigenous Studies 12 or BC First Peoples 12

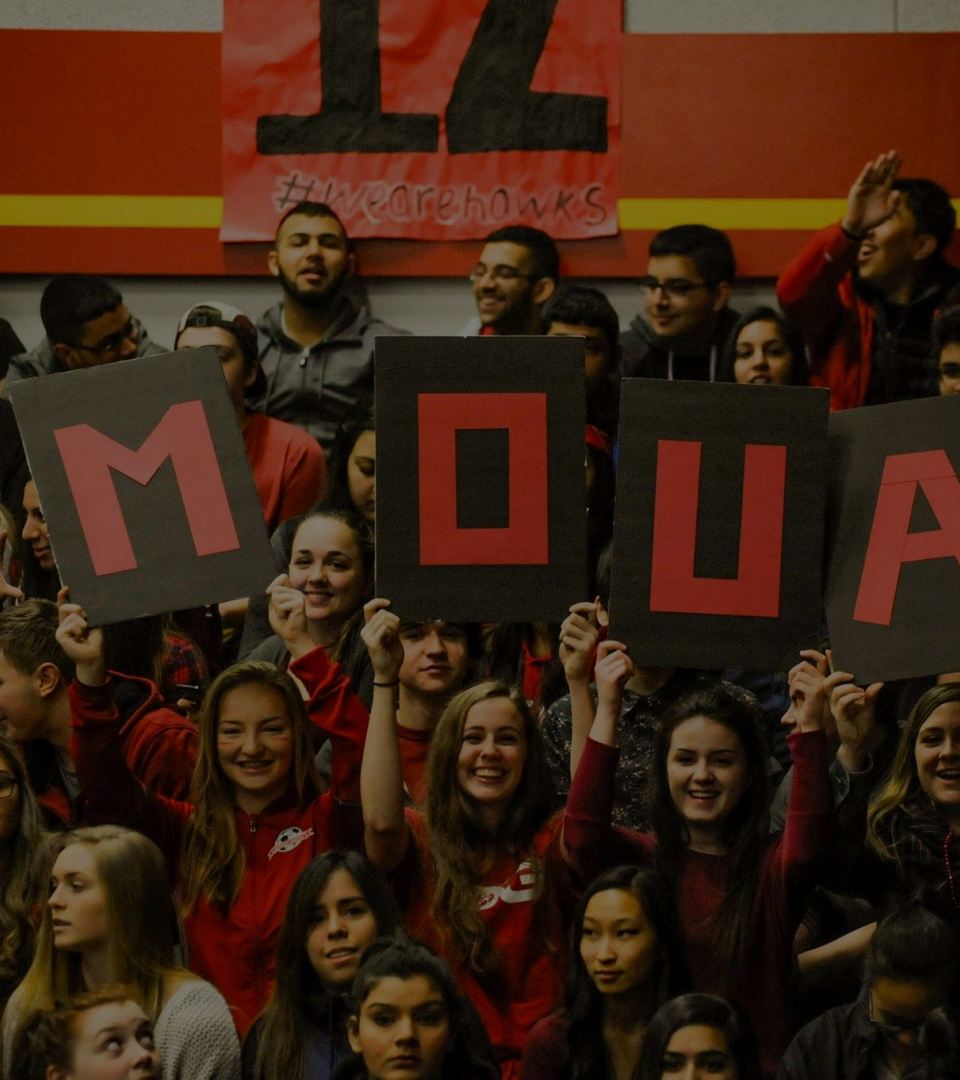




Math Paths at WJ Mouat Secondary School

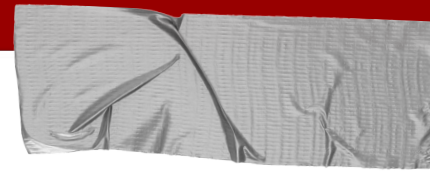


The purpose of this chart is to provide general guidelines. There will always be exceptions.



Electives

- You have 4 elective choices in grade 11 (3 for FI students).
- It is of utmost importance that you go on to the W.J. Mouat website (Parents & Students → Student Services → Course Planning → Course Selection Guide) and **read** the course descriptions carefully before you choose your courses.
- Pick your electives based on interests, passion, career or post-secondary path, or just to have fun learning a new skill.
- Ensure that you meet any prerequisites.



Did you know...

- You must pass one Fine Art (Music, Art, Drama) or Applied Skills course (Business, Drafting, Foods, Textiles, Metal, Wood, Power Technology, Electronics and Robotics) at the grade 10, 11, or 12 level before you graduate. *Languages, Fitness & Conditioning, Outdoor Ed., PE, Student Leadership, Work experience and Journalism do NOT count as a Fine Art or Applied Skill credit*
- If you plan on having a support block or study block (grade 12 **only**), still choose 8 courses and your counsellor will make adjustments later.

You build the timetable

The courses we offer are based on what you and your peers choose now! This is your best opportunity to get the courses you want. In August, the timetable is already built and you will have to choose from whatever has space available.

So make wise choices now.

Languages

You do not need a language 11 to graduate; however, SFU and UBC do require a second language for entry.

Bachelor of Arts program from UFV requires a second language credit prior to UFV graduation if not completed in high school.

Languages and Post Secondary

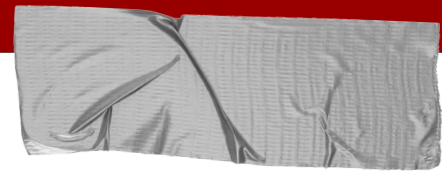
- Having credit for a second language (eg. French) is NOT required for graduation.
 - *However...* some post secondary institutions still require a language 11 credit for entrance (SFU, UBC). It is YOUR responsibility to verify if the post secondary program you want to pursue requires a language 11.
 - You will need Intro Spanish 11 + Spanish 11 to fulfill the language 11 entrance requirement for UBC. SFU will accept Intro Spanish 11 for direct entry.
- How do I get my language credits?
 - French 9, 10, **and** 11 or Intro Spanish 11 **and** Spanish 11 or Language Challenge exams.
- If you speak and write Farsi, French, Spanish, Punjabi, Mandarin, Korean or Japanese you can apply with the Delta School District to write the Language Challenge exam (apply in October each year).

Post Secondary

- This is the time to start researching options and requirements for post-secondary institutions
- Since each post-secondary and each program has differing, specific, and often changing requirements, it is impossible to summarize or generalize entrance requirements
- Each post secondary institution has a website that clearly outlines requirements for students entering from high school
- It is YOUR responsibility to ensure that you have the course and mark (%) requirements for entrance. Ms. Solgaard in the Career Centre can assist you but you'll need to do some of the leg work on your own.

Post Secondary Highlights

- UBC and SFU look at grade 11 marks.
- SFU has very specific requirements depending on the program—careful planning is required.
- A minimum of 5 academic grade 12 courses are required for admission to SFU and UBC.
- Bachelor of Science—be sure to take Physics 11 & Precalc 12
 - Engineering requires Physics 12 & Calculus 12.
- UFV entrance: English 12 (B) & 2 academic 12s.
- Since Fall 2022: UBC requires min. score of 3 on Literacy 12 Assessment.



Next Steps

- Read course descriptions on school website (Parents & Students → Student Services → Course Planning → Course Selection Guide).
- Discuss course selections with your parents/guardians/teachers/counsellors.
- **Log into MyEd and pick at least 8 courses (4 required and 4 electives + 2 alternates).**
 - ◆ **French Immersion: choose Eng 11, Lit 11, Histoire du Monde, a Science 11, and a Math 11 plus 3 electives + 2 alternates**
