How to Complete Grade 11

Required vs Elective Course

Some courses you must pass and others you do not in order to graduate.

For example, you must pass English 11 before you can do English 12.

Summer School

Some courses you can take in summer school and others are not offered.

AVS/Online

Discipline and determination

If you know that you have failed one of the required courses in semester 1 and you did not repeat it in semester 2, you must sign up for that course when you are selecting courses for next year.





Indigenous Content

Between grade 10 to 12, you must complete at least one Indigenous focused course in order to graduate.

This means that you could take an English First Peoples 10, 11, or 12

OR

A Social Studies option: Contemporary Indigenous Studies 12 or BC First Peoples 12





Did you know...

- → You must pass <u>one</u> Fine Art (Music, Art, Drama) <u>or</u> Applied Skills course (Business, Drafting, Foods, Textiles, Metal, Wood, Power Technology, Electronics and Robotics) at the grade 10, 11, or 12 level before you graduate.

 Languages, Fitness & Conditioning, Outdoor Ed., PE, Student Leadership, Work experience, and Journalism do NOT count as a Fine Art or Applied Skill credit
- → If you plan on having a support block or study block (grade 12 **only**), still choose 8 courses and your counsellor will make adjustments later.
- → A second language is not required to graduate in BC





Electives

- You have 6 elective choices/5 if FI in grade 12.
- It is of utmost importance that you go on to the W.J. Mouat website (Parents & Students → Course Planning → Course Selection Guide) and read the course descriptions carefully before you choose your courses.
- Pick your electives based on interests, passion, career or post-secondary path, or just to have fun learning a new skill.
- Ensure that you meet any prerequisites.





- Precalculus 12:
 - Precalculus 11 with 65%
- Calculus 12:
 - Pre-Calc 11 with 70% and enrolled in Pre-Calc 12
- Chemistry 12:
 - Chemistry & Pre-Calc 11 with 73 %
- Anatomy & Physiology 12:
 - Life Sciences & Chemistry 11 with 73%
- Physics 12:
 - o Physics 11 & Precalculus 11 with 73%
- Study block:
 - Grade 12s who have an academically challenging course load (5 academics) and/or outside commitments and/or life circumstances that warrant additional study time may apply. Parent permission and completed application required.




Math Paths at WJ Mouat Secondary School

Languages


You do not need a language 11 to graduate; however, Bachelor of Arts program from UFV requires a second language credit prior to UFV graduation if not completed in high school.


If you speak and write Farsi, French, Spanish, Punjabi, Mandarin, Korean or Japanese you can apply with the Delta School District to write the Language Challenge exam (apply in October each year).




- The SFU requirements have changed and are very specific depending on faculty. You must research and plan carefully.
- Students must consult the website for most accurate information. A and B lists, more emphasis on list A.
- Looks at **all** grade 11 and grade 12 courses for admission evaluation. All coursework including DL (online courses) have June 30 deadline.
- Three years of attendance in English speaking school required or an English language proficiency test must be presented (IELTS, TOEFL, etc.). *India is not included on SFU's list of English speaking countries.*
- General admission requirements:



Required grade 11 courses:

■ English 11, Science 11, Language 11, Pre-Calc.11 or FOM 11, Social Studies 11/12

English Studies 12 (*new: final min. 70%) + four (4) grade 12 academic courses (program specific)







Do I have to plan my entire life by February 17th?

→ BREATHE! No, but if you plan on pursuing post-secondary education, it is important to do your research. Ensure that you are choosing courses that will keep your doors open for admission.

Research post-secondary websites, see Ms. Solgaard, talk with your counsellor and

your parents.

University-approved courses do tend to fill up so make wise choices. Also ensure that you can handle the academic rigour of the courses as you cannot drop them part way through.

→ If absolutely necessary, courses are also available through Night School and AVS.





Next Steps

- Read course descriptions on school website (Parents & Students → Course Planning → Course Selection Guide)
- → Discuss course selections with your parents/guardians/teachers/counsellors.
- → Log into MyEd and pick at least 8 courses (2 required and 6 electives + 2 alternates).
 - ♦ French Immersion: choose Eng 12, FRAL 12, and FCLC12/Communication Orale 12 and 5 electives + 2 alternates
